Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

As we come to know the liturgy better we recognise that it is a masterpiece, wisely shaped over the centuries as the Holy Spirit has guided the Church. Today, as the greatest week of the Church's year begins, the lesson of the liturgy is astoundingly restrained and simple, yet so appropriate.

We are reading from Mark's gospel. In his very simple

telling of the story the brief acclaim of the entry into Jerusalem is in contrast with the stark horror of the story of the passion. The people cry out that 'the kingdom of our father, David, has come'. How ironic is the way in which these words are to be fulfilled!

The reading from Isaiah invites us to learn from the example of the Saviour - the confidence we should have in our Father in heaven, whatever the trials we may face. But it is something else which makes the reading so appropriate on the threshold of Holy Week – with him we must have minds and hearts

open to a new meeting with our God in what lies ahead. Like God's Servant we should be glad that the Lord 'wakes us to hear, to listen like disciples'. We are invited to learn something that it is beyond the power of human words to express; to learn anew the astounding generosity of our God as we meet it in the story of the death and resurrection of Jesus – to find how true is the old saying, 'Actions speak louder than words'.

In the second reading, from the letter to the Philippians – echoing a hymn used in the liturgy of the first generation of the Church – Paul summarises with majestic brevity the drama of what God has done in the Saviour's PASCHAL

MYSTERY: how he 'emptied himself', shared our human condition, even to 'accepting death on a cross', and finally, how he is now 'raised high', one with the Father in the glory of the divine name.

The principal reading, of course, is the telling of the story of the Lord's passion and death, confronting us in Mark's

factual and forthright style, with the cruelty and horror of a horrendous miscarriage of justice. In the darkness which descends upon 'the whole land', the rending of the temple veil 'from top to bottom', and the confession of the gentile centurion - 'In truth this man was a son of God!' - we have the dawning light of the new order of things which will be inaugurated with the Saviour's resurrection.

Actions speak louder than words. The ageold custom of preserving the palms from this day's liturgy is a wonderful reminder of how real was the drama which opened the way to

eternal life for the whole world – a drama in which we are all involved. The liturgies of the Church's coming celebration of the Paschal Mystery will teach us, not with fine oratory, but by recounting the great events in which the divine Truth found expression in our human history. Let this recognition set the tone for our participation in the liturgies of Holy Week.

From Today's Reading

Procession: Mark 11:1-10. We hear the story of Jesus sending two disciples off to prepare for their final meal together, the Passover. Then we learn of His triumphant procession into Jerusalem where a few days later some of these same people will yell "Crucify Him!" In this story, we can tell that Jesus knows what is just ahead of Him, that with each step He comes closer to death. Still, He is willing to go through with it out of obedience to, and love of, His Father and of all mankind.

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7. We hear from the prophet who, like Jesus, was persecuted because the people didn't like what he said. Here he is explaining how he forged ahead even under severe persecution. You might consider Isaiah as being an early version of Jesus, who was thought by his own people to be a prophet.

Responsorial Psalm 22:8-24, begins with the words, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" These are the same words that Jesus cries out from the cross; first because He is human and in anguish, but also because these words were written about Him more than 200 years before as a prophesy of God's suffering servant, a role that Jesus is now fulfilling. The end of this psalm is a victory claim in anticipation of the victory of the Resurrection.

Holy Family Parish Capital Campaign



Holy Family Parish Building and Grounds Update delivered at Masses on March 16 & 17, 2024

Good day, we wanted to give you a brief update on what has been happening in the past month with regards to the Building Restoration. On the outside it may seem nothing is happening, but to the contrary, we are making progress!!

We have received permission from the Archdiocese to proceed with the final design phase.

To quote, "Before approval is given to complete detailed drawings for construction tendering, the final plans will need to be presented to the Archbishop's Office for review by the Archdiocesan Liturgical Commission. Following approval of these plans by the Archbishop, the recommendation to the Archbishop from both the Finance Council and the College of Consultors will be required to proceed to tendering.

As an Archdiocese, we are grateful to Holy Family Parish for their commitment and dedication toward the renovation and renewal of the parish church building project. May the Holy Spirit bless you and your community with joy and peace throughout the year."

We are very excited about this first important step. Stantec has been advised to begin design work on the ceiling. The report for insurance has been sent to the Archdiocese for re-submission; our Building Restoration Committee will be working with the Archdiocese on this matter and hopefully we will be successful with this insurance claim.

Mike Nijman, our building manager, put out a call for volunteers in our parish bulletin. A group of 14 volunteers answered this call and completed the sanding, cleaning, staining and several coats of clear finish. In 3 weeks and 200 hours of volunteer labour the project was completed!! That alone is estimated to have saved us between \$25,000 - \$30,000.00, had been done by an outside contractor. Many thanks to all those volunteers who have done a wonderful job, great teamwork!

Every week the thermometer has been moving upward, with both cash donations and pledge commitments. Currently we are at \$840,000 in pledges, with \$280,000 cash received todate.

Thank-you to those who have made pledges; your 5 year commitment is helping us to move forward with the restoration projects. While there is no deadline to give a pledge, receiving signed pledge forms helps with funding to begin repairs quickly.
