Holy Family Parish is located on Treaty 4 Territory, the traditional lands of the Nêhiyawak, Nahkawé, and Nakota, and homeland of the Dakota, Lakota, and Métis peoples.



The New Testament contains many accounts describing for us the experience of the original disciples of Jesus as they found faith through their encounter with their Risen Lord. The writers of the gospels are so certain of the meetings that laid the foundations of Christian faith that they do not attempt to harmonise the details of the stories they are handing on. They pass on these stories in order to share the wonder of finding faith and new purpose through an encounter with the Lord's triumph – a wonder that can hardly be captured by a single account.

As our Easter liturgies recall these stories we are like a family group listening to one another sharing personal recollections of a past even that meant a great deal to the whole Given from different points of view, these recollections bring a far fully appreciation of what took place. Last Sunday we heard the story as it was recalled in the community of John's gospel. Today, we hear Luke's account of the disciples' meeting with the Risen Saviour.

From all these accounts a coherent story emerges that invites the Church of every age to share in the original moment of Resurrection faith: the disciples are confused and frightened; when Jesus comes into their midst, finding faith in him is not easy and immediate; his greeting, however, and his loving acceptance of them into his abiding friendship brings them a great joy, and they find full faith in him; he instructs them - all that has taken place is according to the designs of God set forth in the Scriptures; he charges them with the mission of bringing to the whole world the good news of their Resurrection faith and the 'forgiveness of sins' it brings; he promises the gift of the Holy Spirit.

All three reading make reference to 'sin' and the need for conversion. Our immediate reaction may well be to think those are themes for Lent, why stress them in the midst of our Easter celebration? But can we understand what has been achieved in the Lord's Paschal Mystery without taking account of the reality of sin. It is the abuse of human freedom that has made the destructive world from which we need to be saved and set free. The words of Peter in the first reading suggest a line of thought which

has relevance for the world in which we live. Quite rightly, our discussion of 'sin' usually stresses what is done with full and wilful responsibility. Peter points to another form of 'sin' when he acknowledges that perpetrators of the terrible miscarriage of justice that has 'killed the prince of life' did not fully understand what they were doing. In today's world of confused moral values, who is to judge the moral guilt of many things that are done? But if what is done is a turning away

from the light to darkness, from what leads to life to what leads to death, it is sinful in the sense that it is an aberration that has destructive consequences from which only God can save us.

Our mission - as those who have found Resurrection faith and the hope it brings - is to bring liberation from sinfulness in all its forms, by sharing the light and life of the Risen Lord with our struggling world.

Take time to read the four Gospel accounts to better understand the sacrifice and suffering that Christ endured on my behalf.

From Today's Reading

First Reading: Acts 3:13-19. In this passage, Peter is telling the crowd on the first Pentecost that it was their sin and ignorance that crucified Jesus. These were probably some of the same people that shouted "Crucify Him" a few weeks earlier, but he goes on to say even now, God will forgive them if they "repent and be converted." We cannot claim ignorance of such an important point of our faith and salvation. This is the central event of our faith. We must do what we can to better understand its meaning and purpose.

Responsorial Psalm 4:2-9 is a prayer that might be said by the souls in Purgatory or by someone who is reflecting on his own life near its end. We might do well to see what this wise penitent has to say, for he speaks as one who has known the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 John 2:1-5a. Here, John the Evangelist is advising us to avoid sin; but because of our human weakness, if we do sin, we have Jesus Christ who is waiting to return us to the Father. However, we must "know" Him in order to partake of the benefits He offers through His death and resurrection. John tells us how we might do that. So listen up! We all need this advice.







AMBO ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE EASTER MASS, March 31, 2024

Good morning to all of you on this special and most holy Sunday of the year.

We want to take this opportunity to provide all of you with a brief update on what has been happening with the renovation to the ceiling in our Nave.

Many of you have been following this situation very closely since last February 26/23; but for some of you, this may be new news. We met with the Archdiocese Finance Committee on February 15/24 and received approval to proceed with the initial drawings for the renovation of the Nave ceiling & the two other projects that will be completed at the same time. We anticipate that we will receive these drawings in a couple of weeks. In addition, we have prepared and sent the necessary financial information to the archdiocese to support our request for a loan of \$900,000. When approved, this will allow us to proceed to detailed drawings and tendering of contracts to complete the work of renovating the ceiling, refurbishing the rest of the nave c/w new carpets and an expanded altar. We will also be renovating the foyer area and replacing the existing carpet there as well. The outside project to replace the front entrance and existing patio bricks is dependent on what we receive from our insurance claim. This project is completely separate from the interior projects; so can be completed now or later as money is available.

One other project that was completed by a volunteer team led by Mike Nijman, was the sanding, staining, and lacquering of the pews that were damaged during COVID. This project has made our pews look new again and saved us approximately \$30,000 if we had gone to an outside contractor. Thank You Mike and your team of volunteers.

Our capital campaign team has been working very diligently to contact parishioners asking them to contribute to this project. We have raised nearly \$340,000 in cash donations and cash pledges, plus an additional \$550,000 in pledges over the next 5 years. This has us well on the way to our \$1.3M goal to complete all the renovations. For those who have contributed to this campaign, a very heart felt thank you! For those who have not donated to date, we ask that you prayerfully think about the future of our parish; and how you can contribute to its future. Any contribution is gratefully accepted. It can be a one-time cash donation, or a pledge over the coming years. You may also want to consider whether a beneficial pledge through your will to the HFP building fund might be an option. These heritage pledges have been a significant part of many other capital campaigns for other parishes and charities. All donations will receive a tax receipt each year.

We are also doing a series of fund raisers, and the recent gala night was a huge success due to the leadership of the KofC with the assistance of the CWL and many other volunteers. They raised over \$15K at this event. Thank You!

Our next event is an offer from the Filipino group touring the country. The Madrigal Concert Singers will hold an additional concert for HFP's renovation project, May 2/24 @ Westminster United Church on 13th Ave. Tickets will be available starting next week by contacting either the office or Murray Knoll and Melinda Toth. Details will be on the website and the bulletin. We urge the whole parish to think about this wonderful opportunity to support our renovation; but also support this world famous and talented group of singers who are in Regina for over a week. They have already SOLD OUT one concert @ Darke Hall and will be providing seminars and clinics throughout the city as well.

We urge all parishioners to keep informed as to what is happening in our parish, and the expected dates for return to masses in our new Nave. We update the parish on a regular basis both in the news bulletin that is published each week, and on the website. We urge all our parishioners to keep our faith at the forefront of their lives; Fr. Wilfred has been pushing us to fill the church to capacity every week, not just on special occasions. Let's get our children involved in the many events and activities that our Youth Coordinator and her volunteers have organized.

Thank you for your time this morning and enjoy a lovely Easter.




