As we have noted, the readings for many Easter liturgies bring us the meditations of John's gospel upon what the life of the Word made flesh means to the world. Sayings of Jesus beginning with 'I AM' abound in this gospel – clearly intimating the Saviour's claim to the divine name itself (cf. Exodus 3:14). They come readily to mind: 'I AM the bread of life' (6:35); 'I AM the gate' (10:9); 'I AM in the

Father' (10:38); 'I AM the way; I AM truth and life. No one can come to the Father except through me' (14:6); 'I AM the true vine' (15:1); 'I want those you have given me to be with me where I AM' (17:24); 'I AM he ... I have told you that I AM HE' (18:5, 8); and the momentous, 'Before Abraham ever was, I AM' (8:58).

The gospel reading of today's liturgy, 'I AM the good shepherd', heard against this background, takes us deep into the mystery of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ – and, as we shall see, it tells us of how God's

initiative in the Paschal Mystery was conceived in the depths of the Trinitarian Life itself.

The Good Shepherd theme has had a great impact on Christian consciousness. One of the earliest and most repeated motifs of Christian art is the youthful shepherd carrying the lost sheep home on his shoulders. The image it suggests is so telling that it has featured prominently in the Church's preaching in every age. As so often happens with the best things in life, we tend to take this theme for granted. Today's text helps us to find a fresh appreciation of its implications. In it Jesus explains these implications by reference to the Paschal Mystery.

He says that he is the 'good' shepherd – in contrast to the unfaithful shepherds who have failed God's people, thinking only of their own interests - because, as he three times repeats, he 'lays down his life' for them. He lays it down, he explains, 'in order to take it up again'. In his Resurrection, he will be a source of life for them. And in this drama of his death and resurrection, he is carrying

out and making clear to the human family what his Father wills for them – an enterprise so dear to the Father that he looks upon the Son's obedience with a renewed love.

It is a plan that works to bring all those who believe into unity. There are other 'folds', or pens, than the one the community that gave us John's gospel finds itself in. Through his Paschal Mystery, the Good Shepherd will lead them in the forming of a single 'flock', overcoming all the apparently insurmountable barriers that divide the human family.

The other readings illustrate the blessings that belong to those who 'know' the Good Shepherd and 'listen to his voice'. We recall the faith and courage of Peter, as he works the Christian Church's first miracle in the power of the divine name – 'in the name of Jesus'. And we are told that we can become 'God's children', through 'the love that the Father lavishes on us', with a future which when it is fully revealed will give us a share in the intimate life of God.

Do I spend time in private prayer in an attempt to get to know or recognize the voice of the divine Shepherd?

From Today's Reading

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12. In this passage, Peter is explaining how he could heal a cripple in such a miraculous way. It was not by his own power, but by the power he was given from God through Jesus Christ. Peter then quotes from Psalm 118, the same Psalm as in today's Responsorial (below). He talks about Jesus being the cornerstone or keystone necessary to bring a foundation or arch together. But this is the One the Jews rejected, and their faith and teaching cannot stand

Responsorial Psalm 118:1. 8-29. By now, this Psalm should be familiar to all because it is used so much during the Easter Season. It continually praises God for giving us so great a gift as His only Son, Our Lord, who steps in to rescue us from a spiritual wandering where there is no return without the divine Shepherd; but the Jews rejected this divine Shepherd and lost their way.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-2. Here, John the Evangelist is telling us that God looks upon every man, woman and child as His own children, and what Father would not love His own children or would deny them the most important part of their life, life itself? In this passage, "life" is taken to mean eternal life; and when we reach that stage, we will be like the glorified Jesus after His Resurrection. Wow! What a gift! Credit: stclareroseville.org







Position Title: Custodian (April 2024)

Overview:

The Custodian is responsible for the internal and external general maintenance and cleanliness of the Parish buildings and grounds as assigned. Custodian reports directly to the Buildings & Grounds Property Manager and Pastor.

Activities/Responsibilities:

- During the course of normal cleaning / maintenance, regularly inspects the parish facilities (internal and external) and grounds to identify needed areas of attention and report these to the Buildings Manager
- Responsible for sanding & snow removal on all side walk areas of the church property during the winter months, with assistance at times from the Building Manager. Hand shoveling and snow blowing is required. The parking lot is contracted out.
- Conduct monthly fire and safety inspections
- Inventory control functions include tracking and ordering inventory for building / maintenance needs in a timely manner following set procedures
- Boiler & furnace filters are changed on a regular basis (pre-determined i.e. 1x month or as identified)
- Be responsible for the setup and take down of items such as chairs and tables, podiums, small equipment, etc. throughout the facility as identified through rental agreements / funerals
- Complete other duties requested by the Building Manager within general custodial duties

Qualifications/Skills/Education/Assets:

- Experience in general and specialty cleaning methods
- Knowledge of cleaning equipment and maintenance of same,
- General landscaping knowledge
- Knowledge of fire regulations, WHMIS (Workplace Hazardous Material Information System) and health and safety procedures.
- Physically able to lift and move objects as required (snow blower, chairs, tables, small cleaning equipment)
- Good organization skills, and the ability to multi-task
- Communicate effectively and understand instructions both orally and written in the English language
- Work independently
- Own a vehicle
- Valid driver's license

Time Commitment:

Flexible hours (day or evening) to complete scheduled cleaning and maintenance

Supervision is provided by:

- Buildings and Property Manager
- May include verbal / written communications with Pastor or office staff regarding the setting up and taking down of chairs, tables, etc., for funerals / liturgical events

Salary:

- Hourly wage range \$17-20 (negotiated at time of acceptance of position based on knowledge, skills, abilities and experience)
- Mileage paid for supply runs at the Archdiocese rate

Typical Duties and Minimum Suggested Timeframes:

- Vacuum foyer, main church areas 1x week or after funeral
- Vacuum sacristy, reconciliation room when required upon inspection
- Vacuum UMR, LMR & Youth Room after use
- Vacuum and dust office areas, including upstairs kitchen 2 x month
- Wipe down kitchen fridge and stove 1x month
- Dust in office areas 2 x month
- Pick up and remove all refuse from all areas and dispose of or recycle 2 x week upon inspection
- Clean bathrooms toilets, sinks, floors Up 1x week
- Clean bathrooms toilets, sinks, floors Down (when required upon inspection after funeral /event)
- Sweep and damp mop all linoleum/tile areas 1x week or upon inspection
- Vacuum all area rugs

 1x week or upon inspection
- Wash Elevator floor, railings, wipe door down inside and outside 1 x week
- Wash all main entrance door windows, wipe down handles 1 x week
- Wash all windows inside and out in UMR, LMR, Youth Room, Offices 2 times per year
- Wash Hall floors and kitchen floor area when required upon inspection (after funeral / event)
- Dust all ledges, door bars, tops of cupboards, etc., in sacristy, reconciliation room when required upon inspection
- Dust foyer, main church areas of ledges, door bars, radiators, etc. (including Altar area, Stations of the Cross, Statues, etc.) – 1x month
- Check all lighting to ensure no outages, replace bulbs as determined safe to do so, otherwise notify Building Manager – as determined while working in the area
- Change furnace filters (per set time frame, approx every 45 days)
- Change / clean filters on floor washing machine (when required upon inspection)

Seasonal:

- Cut lawns, weed, as or when required 1x wk
- Remove snow from doors to church at the back and front as required for safety
- Remove snow from steps and stairs and landing at the front of the church, also from north fire exit doors - as required for safety
- Sand when required to ensure safety as required
- Put up and take down Nativity Scene (Dec. 1 and Jan 10)




