13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Where is my life leading? A question many people ask themselves today – as the things that really matter are lost sight of in a haze of materialism and hedonism. We read in the weekend papers of people seeking to give their lives a new direction, because wealth and acclaim have left them with a sense of emptiness. If this spiritual emptiness is more widespread in today's world, the problem is not new. St Paul's advice for the Galatians, in our second reading - describing the 'self-indulgence' of the times as a kind of bondage - is as meaningful today as when it was first written.

It is our fundamental decisions that give direction to our lives. In today's gospel reading from Luke, Jesus begins to instruct his disciples, preparing them for the decisions that lie ahead of them. The example of Jesus, in the direction he gives to his life, is clearly affirmed - 'the time draws near for him to be taken up', and 'Jesus resolutely took the road for Jerusalem'. He shared our life to the full; he too had to make the painful human decisions that gave direction to his life. In these decisions, he was 'resolute', faithful to the end in expressing the generous ways of his Father. Our lives are shaped by the basic decisions we have made - concerning family priorities, concerning our professional responsibilities, concerning our attitudes as neighbours and citizens. As this gospel reading takes us into the company of Jesus, let us ask ourselves how responsible we are in the making of these life decisions, and how resolute we are in putting them into practice.

Luke presses home the lesson, recalling, at this point, three surprising responses made by Jesus to those who sought to

become his followers. Jesus used words to great effect. The crowds followed him to hear his words of wisdom and encouragement. Many of his off-the-cuff sayings have become proverbial. But the prophet from Nazareth was not the ordinary kind of storyteller, he overturned people's expectations. In the usual way of things, a good story reconciles us, in the end, to the wholesomeness that is inherent to our human affairs; and proverbs sound a note that reassures us that there is a predictable order in things. The parables of Jesus, however, invite us to leave behind the reassurances of our familiar world, and to enter into the new order of things he called the 'Kingdom' of his Father – where the last may be first, and the one who shows himself to be our true friend may be a traditional enemy. Similarly, the three responses in today's gospel, though they are like proverbs, are meant to bring a shock that confronts us with the radical nature of our decision to be a follower of Jesus. They should be taken in this spirit, rather than as literal prescriptions. There may be a little ironical humour implied, also – for instance, if the father who is to be buried is still hale and hearty.

Those who take seriously the invitation to follow Jesus, with all its radical implications, will never regret their decision – as the history of the Church has proved age after age.

From Today's Reading

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b-21. Elijah, one of the non-literary prophets of the early Jewish monarchy, is told by God to transfer his authority to Elisha. Elisha immediately seems to agree but needs to attend to some responsibilities first. This seems to annoy Elijah. But the transfer takes place by the throwing of the cloak over the shoulders of Elisha, who then follows Elijah.

Responsorial Psalm 16:1-11. This is a song that can be sung by anyone who has put his trust in the Lord and is willing to take up whatever task the Lord has given him, knowing that the Lord is there with him *"at his right hand."* Has the Lord ever asked you to take on a project or mission that you didn't expect? Or perhaps it was just a simple task like speaking up when someone opens the conversation to a subject where you could contribute from your faith. How did you respond?

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18. In this passage, Paul is talking about *"freedom,"* but in a context that applies to being bound to religious or cultural rules or customs that bind us against our will. He then goes on to explain that faith in God will free us from religious bondage, through love and its application to everyday life because *"Love of neighbor fulfills the Law."* The responsibility is still there, but in a much lighter context.

Dear Faithful of the Archdiocese of Regina,

As you know, Pope Francis is coming to Canada to meet with Residential School Survivors. The Papal Visit is scheduled for July 25-29, just a few weeks away. At this time, he will visit 3 hub locations across Canada to meet with as many First Nations, Métis, and Inuit People as possible. The nearest location to us is Edmonton, along with a First Nation community which was a residential school site.

The journey towards Truth and Reconciliation is one we must take together. As I mentioned to the clergy when I spoke with them at the end of our annual retreat, I am asking for your support as we take the next critical step.

The Papal Visit is cause for great hope. Although we are disappointed that the Pope will not visit Saskatchewan, the Archdiocese of Regina is working to ensure survivors of Catholic-run residential schools can engage with this event in any way that may offer them peace and healing.

Your prayerful support is needed during this time.

For survivors who will travel to witness the Pope's apology in Alberta, we are providing travel, accommodations, and meals. We will partner with a First Nation and Métis community who prefer to make their own travel arrangements, offering assistance in any way that we can. We will also create spaces for survivors who would prefer to watch a live stream from Regina, or who wish to gather with their First Nation or Métis community at a location of their choosing.

We need your help to ensure the ultimate comfort and care are available for Indigenous Brothers and Sisters during the Papal Visit. If you are looking to be involved, there are several opportunities:

For \$500, you can sponsor a survivor's journey to meet the Pope.

This includes the cost of buses, hotel, and food for a survivor or for a support person who will be with them on this difficult but hopeful journey.

For \$5,000, you can sponsor a bus that would bring survivors to the meeting with Pope Francis.

For communities who wish to arrange their own travel, your support would extend our partnership to cover some of their cost of bus transportation.

You may also pledge any amount that will directly help survivors during this time.

Whether this be funding some portion of travel to meet the Pope, or supporting those survivors who will participate without travelling, absolutely any amount would make a meaningful difference.

You may also consider other ways to contribute your time, talent, and treasure.

From preparing care packages, to volunteering, I encourage you to prayerfully consider the ways in which you and your local parish could offer to walk with survivors during the Papal Visit.

As I'm sure you can appreciate, with this event so near in the future, it would be incredibly helpful to hear if and how you may wish to offer support. While we would be accepting of any financial support after the fact, if your group intends on supporting this cause, it would be very helpful if you could let us know by the end of June.

The Papal Visit, and subsequent apology, are incredibly important steps in healing this relationship – a relationship marred with deep hurt and countless wounds. Though as survivors have expressed over and over again, this does not end with the Pope's visit and apology. Our collective journey of healing is just beginning.

Thank you for your support for this very important step along the way.
