As our destination draws near, at the end of an important journey, we may well have mixed feelings. We look forward to arrival; but we may be uncertain and anxious about the outcome.

As we face the challenge of entering deeply into the climax of the Church's year of faith - the commemoration of the Saviour's PASCHAL MYSTERY - it is as if the liturgy of this last Sunday of our anticipates our mood and journey reassures us. The readings bring us some of the greatest texts of the Scriptures, texts which - as we stand among the Greek pilgrims who wanted to 'see Jesus' - help us, in the words of the gospel, to come to terms with 'the kind of death Jesus was to die'.

The horror of the Saviour's Cross is plainly stated: his 'obedience' to the Father's will, according the letter to the Hebrews, is

made with 'prayer and entreaty, with loud cries and tears'. And John's gospel tells us, 'his soul was troubled', as his fateful 'hour' approached - in which he was to give all, like 'a wheat grain' which 'falls on the ground and dies'.

If he invites us to share this fate with him – 'wherever I am, my servant will be there too' – he also helps us to trust in his Father, as we face the ordeals of our personal lives. His prayer is 'heard', and through the sufferings which have been a sharing in the destructiveness and darkness of our world, he enters into a new and final



existence. In the words of the letter to the Hebrews, he is 'made perfect'; as John's gospel puts it, he is 'glorified'. This is a powerful statement in biblical language - God's 'glory' is the incomparable divine greatness. Having 'emptied himself' to become one with us, the manhood he

shares with us is now filled with divine greatness – and the grain which falls to the ground 'yields a rich harvest', transforming the whole of creation.

The outcome is certain, therefore, and beyond all humanity's imagining. It is the inauguration of the 'new covenant written in our hearts', foretold by Jeremiah, and sealed with the Saviour's blood. The Crucified One will become 'a source of eternal salvation' for all who become his followers (Hebrews). Having been 'lifted up from the earth', he will 'draw all people to himself', that they may share in his new existence (John).

The Church's liturgy prepares us well for what lies at the end of our journey. May it prove a faith-filled meeting with the generosity of our God, for each one of us.

From Today's Reading

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34. Here, the Prophet is warning the people of Israel and Judah that because of their lack of faith and obedience to the Laws of Moses and to God Himself, God will make void His covenant with them and make a "new" one with different terms and conditions. This is referring to the New and Everlasting Covenant signed and sealed with the blood of Jesus Christ.

Responsorial Psalm 51:3-15 is the great penitential psalm; the Miserere. It is a reflection on the sin of David, but it can and should be our prayer of contrition for any and all offenses that we might have committed. You are encouraged to read and meditate on the entire Psalm frequently during Lent, but particularly on Good Friday.

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:7-9. The writer of this great "letter" has summed up in this single sentence the essence of Christ's Passion and Death, both in its human form and its divine form. We must remember that although Jesus was God, He was also human. His suffering was real and more intense than we could endure, but through His sacrifice, He achieved the goal that was prophesied by Jeremiah above. 



Dear Friends,

It is with heartfelt prayer and a renewed spirit of compassion that we enter this Lenten season. This year, as in other years, we are surrounded by the suffering and needs of others, which can overwhelm and overcome us. We hear the cries of our time in the prophet Jeremiah, who laments,

"My anguish, my anguish! I writhe in pain! Oh, the walls of my heart! My heart is beating wildly; I cannot keep silent; for I hear the sound of the trumpet, the alarm of war."ⁱ

This prayer for deliverance comes from the depths of the prophet's soul. These words echo Christ's words on the Cross, which we will hear during Holy Week, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"ⁱⁱ As we look around, war and violence seem to arise in every corner of the earth. Disasters, both natural and human-caused, affect everyone in some way, but particularly affect those who are marginalized, lacking permanent shelter, and without adequate resources. Most especially, our hearts go out to those who lack even food during these times of upheaval. With great distress, we learn that even in an age of apparent wealth and opulence, there are over 828 million people, created in the image and likeness of God, who go to bed hungry each night.ⁱⁱⁱ

God invites us to seek ways to join in the healing of the wounds of our sisters and brothers. Development and Peace – Caritas Canada provides a way for us to reach out to people we will likely never meet, but who are our sisters and brothers in the Lord., Through its projects, Development and Peace seeks to provide an active and life-changing solidarity with those in need, and who in many ways are being forgotten.

Development and Peace stands with small-scale food producers, such as farmers, fisherfolk, and pastoralists, who form the social fiber of countless communities and feed most of the world's population while still experiencing a large degree of poverty themselves.^{iv} Through its partners, Development and Peace accompanies those who work every day to feed their families and communities by the generous bounty of God's creation. In Nigeria, the Health of Mother Earth Foundation (HOMEF) helps farmers stand up for their rights and recover community land from rampant oil pollution. In Indonesia, PAYOPAYO (which means "Scarecrow" in the local Mandar language, a symbol of friendship and mutual support among the rural folk) supports community-wide youth engagement in sustainable agriculture. Finally, in Bolivia, Fundacion Nuna Bolivia helps families improve their farming techniques to produce a variety of foods, ensuring ecological and economic sustainability for their community. Development and Peace reminds us that it is with and through these partner organizations, made up of extraordinary people, that we can effect tremendous change in our global community.^v

I urge you to support Development and Peace – Caritas Canada in their campaign for 2024, **Create Hope: Reaping our Rights**, by giving generously to Share Lent collections at your parish (or through the means listed below). I invite you to be inspired by the ingenuity of the grassroots organizations that partner with Development and Peace by hearing their stories and sharing them with your friends, families, and parish communities. Above all, I encourage you pray for all those who work for justice in our country and in every corner of our world. God is at work in our world, and invites us to join in this holy and arduous work of restoring peace and justice to our wounded world.


