32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The last section of Matthew's gospel, before the narrative of the passion and resurrection, is a collection of Jesus' teachings urging readiness for death and judgment. The gospel readings for the liturgies of today and next Sunday (the last Sundays of the year's cycle) are from this section. Today we hear the parable of the wise and foolish bridesmaids. The stern tone of the parable should not obscure for us the festive background this story would have called to mind for the original audience. The wedding customs of Palestine – different from our own – have not changed much over the centuries. They come to a climax

with the arrival of the bridegroom and his friends at the home of the bride. Upon his arrival, the friends of the bride, who have been waiting with her, go out to join the groom's party for a ceremonial entrance. Those who heard the parable would have recalled that in the Old Testament, Israel's God was called the bridegroom of Israel. The rabbis used the espousal imagery of the Song of Songs in recalling this theme. The members of Matthew's community would have recalled that Jesus referred to himself as 'the bridegroom' (cf. Mt 9:35). The whole emphasis of the parable story,

it is clear, is readiness for the coming of the Bridegroom. The 'cry' that goes up when he arrives, capturing the festive joy of the occasion, tells us of the eagerness with which the first Christians looked forward to the Lord's return. All the bride's friends are asleep – the Saviour's return, whether in the moment of death or at the end of the world's history - will come as a surprise to all. Though they are asleep, the wise bridesmaids are ready. Like the lover in the Song of Songs, they can say, 'I sleep, but my heart is awake'. We should not be distracted by their abrupt refusal to share their oil. Remember, in their original form the parables have one point to make. The foolish bridesmaids are removed from the scene to emphasis the

point that only those who are ready will join in the festivities.


The first reading, from the book of Wisdom, is well chosen. In his story, Jesus calls the maidens who are ready 'wise'. Wisdom is greatly prized by the traditions of the world; it is a knowledge that helps us understand the things that really matter. Wisdom belongs to a set of Old Testament writings that give expression to a spirituality nourished by an outlook that comes from living one's life in harmony with the ways of God. As the parable invites us to ask ourselves whether we are ready to meet our Lord, and to review the

loyalties and values that shape our lives, we may well ponder what is offered to us by God's Word in the first reading: the joy and peace that come from being in tune with God is there to be 'found by those who look'.

The first Christians looked forward eagerly to the Lord's return. With the passing of time, it became clear then to their period of waiting would be long. With the Saviour's resurrection, the last moment of God's plan has come; but as the second letter of Peter reminded those concerned about this delay, 'With the Lord, a

day is like a thousand years' (3:8). These developments are echoed in the reading from 1Thessalonians. It seems that when they embraced the faith and rejoiced in the union with Christ brought by baptism this community thought that they would not see death before the Lord's return. Some have died, however, and Paul is instructing them to remove their confusion. With them we can look forward to festivities in store for us. 'The Spirit and the Bride say, Come! ... Come, Lord Jesus' (Rev 22, 17, 20).





This Nation named after Chief Standing Buffalo (Tatankanaje/Tatanka Najin) is not a signatory to Treaty 4 but are protected under the Indian Act. The Canadian government refused to recognize that the Dakota had land in Treaty 4 (cbc.ca/news/canada/ saskatchewan/ottawa-rejects-claims-by-dakota-lakotafirst-nations-1.669072 territory because as descendants of Chief Sitting Bull they were viewed as American refugees. It has one of the best reserve-based lacrosse programs (standingbuffalodakotanation.com/lacrosse) North America. It became a powerhouse program winning league, provincial, and national Championships.





Holy Family Parish Building and Grounds Update by David Carvell, Parish Finance Council Chair:

We have had one meeting with the Archdiocese Finance Committee as mentioned earlier, and now several planning meetings with the two key committees that will be leading this process.

Dwayne Gelowitz and his Renovation & Renewal Committee have determined that Stantec Architecture would be the best option to determine the root cause of the ceiling collapse and to offer services to provide design drawings and options for us to consider for refreshing the entire Nave and Foyer areas.

We needed to receive confirmation and approval from the Bishop before we could complete a contract with them and move forward. This approval was received Friday morning, and Dwayne has contacted Stantec to sign a contract and begin the process of examining both the exterior roof and interior ceiling to see what caused the failure and to make recommendations for fixing the issues.

Our agreement with Stantec will include several meetings along the way where we can ask questions and offer ideas and recommendations, so that they can proceed to a point where they could give us some preliminary budgets and recommendations for the tendering process.

At that point we plan a town hall meeting in the parish to give you more detailed information about the project and answer the questions that you may have. This will take approximately 3-4 weeks. After this we would finalize the scope of our agreement and move to detailed design and reconfirm construction materials etc.

Our plan is to have Stantec take us through to the tendering process and then review final tender pricing etc. This will be where we must make a final decision on whether we can proceed or not.

The main issue will be funding, and we will need to have cash and/or confirmed commitments for approximately 50% before the Archdiocese will consider working with us on a mortgage for the remainder. We may decide to do some stepped portions of the project based on financial commitments that we have received.

On the other side of this is the Capital Campaign that David Cundall is leading. He and his very small team have developed the initial plan and will begin meetings with some potential key donors over the coming weeks. David has asked me to request our parish for two or three key leaders to step forward to assist him. We are looking for one key individual to contact David Cundall regarding assisting as Co-Chair, as David Cundall is experiencing time constraints because of his work commitments and family commitments. Therefore, I ask that someone step forward to this critical committee to assist David.

The success that David and his team achieve over the next few weeks will be critical to whether we move forward with this project or not. Please feel free to discuss with Fr. Wilfred, David Cundall, or my-self [David Carvell] how you might be able to make a significant contribution towards this project. The smaller fundraising initiatives that we have been doing and will continue to do will not get us close to our final goal. They are excellent for building community within the parish as well as keeping everyone involved; however only with major contributions will we be able to meet our goal.
