The tableau in today's gospel concludes Matthew's collection of the teachings of Jesus concerning the End. Unique to Matthew's gospel, it is a masterpiece. Strictly speaking, it is not a parable, but an allegory – a narrative in which details have symbolic significance. It may be the development of a simple parable, in which Jesus likened the expected coming of the 'Son of Man' with divine authority (Dan 7) to a shepherd 'separating sheep from goats'. It provides, in a simple form, a splendid summary of the teaching of Jesus in Matthew's gospel, concerning the living of our Christian faith.

For the first Christians, Jesus was the 'Son of Man', invested in his risen glory with divine authority (Mt 26:64). In today's second reading, Paul celebrates the divine authority with which the Saviour brings his saving work to completion. In the triumph of the resurrection he has authority over the whole of creation; when 'the end' comes, having overcome all the forces of evil, he will deliver the New Creation into the hands of his Father, and those who share in his triumph will rejoice in a divine generosity that has no limits. Paul's account of 'the end' is

somewhat overwhelming. Matthew's tableau, on the other hand, presents the final Judgment in terms that are easy to understand – terms that can be related to the ways of God that found expression in the Sermon on the Mount. Despite its simplicity, however, the more we ponder this tableau the more we come to appreciate how rich it is in inspiration for those who want to live as followers of Jesus.

The criterion by which we will be judged when we come into the presence of God is practical, simple and clear. It is not so much what we do for the God 'we cannot see' that matters, in the end, but what we do for one another – expressing the fact that we are true children of the same Father (cf.1 Jn 4:20). And among God's children it is the



poor and needy who should have our special care – our 'preferential option'. The things that will establish our worth in the sight of God, and our readiness to share in God's friendship, are simple things, possible to all, learned and simple, rich and poor. What overturns our expectations and is immensely reassuring is the fact that those who have proved themselves worthy of hearing the Lord's invitation – 'Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world' – may well be taken unawares. Responding to

the grace of God, working in them 'in a hidden way' (Gaudium et spes, n.22), they have shown themselves true children of the Father – helping for the sake of those in need, without any thought of a reward. Matthew's tableau finds a place among the elect for all who fight unselfishly humanity's ancient enemies: 'ignorance, poverty, disease, injustice, bigotry, death of body or soul' (B. Vawter). The greatest inspiration of all, however, is found in the Lord's affirmation, 'You did it to me'. Sharing our humanity and experience in a struggling world, the 'Son of Man' has made himself one in a

privileged way with those in greatest need.

Placing us on the threshold of the final Kingdom, this tableau gives us a glimpse of what it will be like – one family of the Father, united in God's generous and merciful ways. Today, we venerate Christ the King; today's gospel reminds us that it is only in his final 'glory' that he exercised his kingship. Among us, he makes himself the 'Servant' of all.

From Today's Reading

First Reading: Ezekiel 34:11-17. In this passage, we hear God the Father telling the people of Israel in the 6th century BC that He is not pleased with their Leadership. He threatens to abolish their positions and become their leader Himself. All this is done in the context of symbolism of a shepherd tending his flock in a manner fitting of a good shepherd. At this time, in the life of Israel, the people had enough of kings and forced homage and were looking for sincere leadership that would help them find a better life. Thus, the Father promises all of this and more, treating each of His sheep individually.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 23:1-6 is again, the Psalm that we have heard so often recently known as "The Lord is my Shepherd." This beautiful prayer echoes the First Reading by bringing the loftiness of the relationship of God to Man down to the level of a shepherd tending his sheep with loving care and protection. The "Good Shepherd" will do anything to care for and protect his sheep, even to the point of laying down his life - and so He did!

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-28. Here, Paul expands on the above statement by telling us how Jesus, the Son of God, repaired the breach between God and Man created by Adam's sin






FAQ: How can the Catechism be most effectively used by catechists?







Holy Family Parish Building and Grounds Update by David Carvell, Parish Finance Council Chair:

We have had one meeting with the Archdiocese Finance Committee as mentioned earlier, and now several planning meetings with the two key committees that will be leading this process.

Dwayne Gelowitz and his Renovation & Renewal Committee have determined that Stantec Architecture would be the best option to determine the root cause of the ceiling collapse and to offer services to provide design drawings and options for us to consider for refreshing the entire Nave and Foyer areas.

We needed to receive confirmation and approval from the Bishop before we could complete a contract with them and move forward. This approval was received Friday morning, and Dwayne has contacted Stantec to sign a contract and begin the process of examining both the exterior roof and interior ceiling to see what caused the failure and to make recommendations for fixing the issues.

Our agreement with Stantec will include several meetings along the way where we can ask questions and offer ideas and recommendations, so that they can proceed to a point where they could give us some preliminary budgets and recommendations for the tendering process.

At that point we plan a town hall meeting in the parish to give you more detailed information about the project and answer the questions that you may have. This will take approximately 3-4 weeks. After this we would finalize the scope of our agreement and move to detailed design and reconfirm construction materials etc.

Our plan is to have Stantec take us through to the tendering process and then review final tender pricing etc. This will be where we must make a final decision on whether we can proceed or not.

The main issue will be funding, and we will need to have cash and/or confirmed commitments for approximately 50% before the Archdiocese will consider working with us on a mortgage for the remainder. We may decide to do some stepped portions of the project based on financial commitments that we have received.

On the other side of this is the Capital Campaign that David Cundall is leading. He and his very small team have developed the initial plan and will begin meetings with some potential key donors over the coming weeks. David has asked me to request our parish for two or three key leaders to step forward to assist him. We are looking for one key individual to contact David Cundall regarding assisting as Co-Chair, as David Cundall is experiencing time constraints because of his work commitments and family commitments. Therefore, I ask that someone step forward to this critical committee to assist David.

The success that David and his team achieve over the next few weeks will be critical to whether we move forward with this project or not. Please feel free to discuss with Fr. Wilfred, David Cundall, or my-self [David Carvell] how you might be able to make a significant contribution towards this project. The smaller fundraising initiatives that we have been doing and will continue to do will not get us close to our final goal. They are excellent for building community within the parish as well as keeping everyone involved; however only with major contributions will we be able to meet our goal.
