Holy Family Parish is located on Treaty 4 Territory, the traditional lands of the Nêhiyawak, Nahkawé, and Nakota, and homeland of the Dakota, Lakota, and Métis peoples.

Second Sunday of Advent

As we prepare to celebrate the Lord's 'coming' at Christmas, our Advent liturgies invite us to a fuller appreciation of the great plan of God – a plan that will reach its climax with the inauguration of God's final Kingdom, in the 'second coming' of the Saviour.

We read again from the final chapters of the Book of Isaiah. This amazing passage helps us to understand the wonder and joy with which the apostolic generation read

the texts of the Old Testament, and recognised that they had been fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Their faith in Christ, they proclaimed, was 'according to the Scriptures' (Lk 24:27; 1 Cor 15:4 etc.) In this passage, the message of God's generous ways already finds a sublime and inspiring expression: 'Console my people, console them, speak to their hearts'; let the 'joyful messenger' proclaim God's presence in their midst; God will lead the exiled people home through the wilderness, in a new Exodus; Israel's God will be 'like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering the lambs in his arms'.

This Old Testament text provides the background for the gospel reading, which is the opening passage of Mark's gospel – 'the beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ the Son of God'. It is echoed by Mark, in his quotation from 'the book of the prophet Isaiah' (His quotation, in fact, combines two other Old Testament texts with the words from Isaiah). John the Baptist appears as the 'messenger' foretold. He 'prepares a way' for the Saviour, who – in his Paschal Mystery – will lead God's people in the final Exodus of God's great plan. He will prove himself a 'Good Shepherd' to a people

'harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd' (Mt 9:36). Mark's description of the Baptist – wearing 'a garment of camel skin' and living on 'locusts and wild honey' – presents him as another Elijah: the old prophet whose witness to the unique divinity of the God of Israel made him a legendary model of the prophet's role. John's 'baptism of repentance' prepared for the coming of the Saviour; and all generations of Christians have been

inspired by his humble 'Advent' witness to the one would 'baptise with the Holy Spirit' – 'I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals'.

2 Peter, from which our other reading comes – with its reference to the 'Second Coming' of the Saviour – is one of the last texts of the New Testament to be written. It reflects the mood of the early Church, as it comes to terms with the fact that they faced an indefinite wait before the Lord's promised return. Like them we must bow before the mystery of God's ways, maintaining an alert faith in the certain, but unknowable,

final return of the Saviour. If we must look forward to our familiar world coming to an end – as foretold in the dramatic imagery of the prophets – we should not be frightened, because creation will be transformed in a 'new heaven and new earth', in which all the things we hold dear will be filled with the 'righteousness', or incomparable goodness, of God's ways.

From Today's Reading

First Reading: Isaiah 40:1-11. The prophet is speaking to the people of Israel soon after the end of the Babylonian Exile, (late 6th century BC). The Israelites are returning with new hopes and dreams and a new determination to be faithful and obedient to God. So the prophet is preaching to them to open their hearts and clear away anything that would prevent the God of Israel from entering and being with them in spirit. This was only partially successful. What would be your response today?

Responsorial Psalm 85:9-14. Here the psalmist continues the message of Isaiah above, telling his people and us that if we give our hearts to God, He will give us blessings beyond our wildest dreams, beginning with peace and all the other spiritual blessings to follow.

Second Reading: 2 Peter 3:8-14. In this seldom read letter, Peter admonishes us to be prepared for the coming of the Lord at our own death, as well as at the end of the world. If we look to this life only, what will we have when Christ comes for us? This world will eventually pass away, so why hang on to things of this world?





HOLY FAMILY FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Submitted to the Parish Pastoral Council meeting on December 4, 2023



October & November were very active months, with meetings with representatives from Stantec & PCL to set the scope of their work and then to discuss the findings of their inspections and to receive some of the initial ideas for how to replace the ceiling and to enlarge the altar.

Next was two or three meetings with the various "Raise the Roof" committees to continue to develop our plans on how to move forward with both the design of the project and the financing of the project. Holidays and illness have slowed this whole process down. We have further meetings planned for December to receive their final inspection report and discuss initial drawings and ideas for the renovation project. PCL is presently doing a costing and will present their cost estimates to us at that time.

We did complete an open house parish meeting on Thursday, November 30, 2023; with 75 parishioners in attendance. We presented outlines of how the process has moved forward from the collapse of the ceiling to this point. There were several comments and questions asked by parishioners; and I am sure we will have more once everyone goes home and has a chance to digest all the info that was presented. The parish team are going to put the complete presentation on the website this week, and we will be putting timely communication points in the bulletin on a regular basis. If you have suggestions for this, please email to me so that we can see how they might fit. Our plan is to have another open house meeting in early January 2024 when we have some of the cost estimates and drawings; so that people can see what we are planning.

Several questions about "How Much" & "How do we Pay"! David Cundall had an excellent presentation (please see next page) on how a funding pyramid is the best method to achieve our goal. He and his team are now developing the Pledge forms and a methodology for "Parishioners to bequeath funds to the parish in their wills!" This is something that HFP has not done in the past; but other parishes have used to generate substantial funds over the years.

On the financial side, our donations are up approximately \$16K from last year. Sunday envelopes, and loose collections show the largest increases. This is because of several new families coming into the parish and using these methods to donate. Our direct deposit method is up about 3%. Much of this is attributable to the large increase in donations to the building fund, I won't have exact details until we close the books in the new year.

Our expenses are tracking very well, with most near or under budget. We just received invoices for the Priest Pension fund and Diocesan Assessment. These were only received last year at year end. Out Diocesan Assessment is up approximately \$7500 because of our larger collections.

Our Finance Team is developing some methods to segregate the "Raise the Roof" funds; so that we can track these independently and more easily. I also plan to remove these funds from our General Revenue account, so that we have a clearer picture of where we are with operations. As of October 31, 2023, we have a small surplus but there are some timing issues with staff salaries etc that will bring this to breakeven.

I anticipate that we will continue to see larger donations over the Advent and holiday season, as people make contributions prior to December 31/23 to receive receipts for income tax. We will be putting this into the bulletin and website over the next few weeks.





Second Sunday of Advent

National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples

On 12 December, Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, the Church in Canada celebrates the National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples. This year, we take a moment to recall the Holy Father's Penitential Pilgrimage to Canada in July 2022, and in particular his words of prayer offered at Lac Ste. Anne:

In this blessed place, where harmony and peace reign, we present to you the disharmony of our experiences, the terrible effects of colonization, the indelible pain of so many families, grandparents and children. Lord, help us to be healed of our wounds. We know, Lord, that this requires effort, care and concrete actions on our part; but we also know that we cannot do this alone. We rely on you and on the intercession of your mother and your grandmother. Yes, Lord, we entrust ourselves to the intercession of your mother and your grandmother, because mothers and grandmothers help to heal the wounds of our hearts."




Bring the Baby Jesus figure from your family's Nativity to Mass at Holy Family Parish and have it blessed!
