## **3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Today's liturgy invites us to take up again the reflections on Christian discipleship that we began last Sunday. Last week we considered what Christian discipleship has in common with the following of inspiring human leaders. The vivid picture painted by Mark in today's gospel reading highlights characteristics of Christian discipleship

that have no parallel in the world of human discipleship.

In our common human experience, the decision to become a disciple is first and foremost a decision made by the follower. The decision to become a disciple of the Saviour has its origin in the decision and call of the Lord himself. Mark's brief narrative probably has its basis in a more complex sequence of events - in which the four fishermen have already heard the 'Good News' preached by Jesus, that 'the kingdom of God is close at hand': alluded to in the

previous verses. But Mark wishes to emphasise the authoritative call of Jesus as the basis of the relationship they enter into, and the unconditional nature of their response. 'You did not choose me, no. I choose you' – these words of Jesus at the supper, in John's gospel, are addressed to each of us. Our relationship with the Lord is grounded in his decision on our behalf and his eternal fidelity.

Responding to the call of Jesus – like all the great decisions of a full and generous life – is not without its cost. We are reminded of this by Mark's stark narrative - as the four leave behind old securities and their kinsfolk to throw in their lot with Jesus.

The choice of Jesus is not related to any previous



formation or qualifications. Mark describes the call as coming to them unexpectedly, in the midst of their daily work. As successful fishermen, with hired labour, they were probably literate and relatively well informed in the faith of old Israel. But this is of no consequence in Mark's narrative. We who are called together to form the

community of the Lord's disciples come from different backgrounds and outlooks, young and old, rich and poor; united in our discipleship of the one Lord we must show the world all that a generous following of Christ has to offer the human family – nothing less than a foretaste of the final Kingdom.

'I will make you fishers of men' – the call to discipleship is an invitation to share in the mission of Jesus, to share his responsibility for the whole human family. If the Church in which we believe is the community of those who have responded to this call, Mark's

account presents Jesus as beginning to create the Church at the very outset of his ministry.

The contrast between the relationship entered into by Jewish rabbi of the time of Jesus, and the relationship the Saviour entered into with his disciples has often been remarked upon. 'Follow me' – these words give expression to a decision made from all eternity, a decision that will never be revoked, as he leads us to share in his own eternal destiny.

#### From Today's Reading

**First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10.** Here we have the familiar story of Jonah (minus the first story) who is commanded by God to preach to the people of Nineveh a message of repentance for their sinful ways. Now, repentance is not the same as penance. Repentance is the intentional decision to turn from evil and all things that could lead us to evil. Penance is our expression of sorrow or contrition and some outward sign of making up for past sinful deeds. So, the Ninevites got the message. They repented and did penance and they were saved.

**Responsorial Psalm 25:4–9** is a prayer that the Ninevites might have prayed when asking for forgiveness, but they were not Jews and probably did not know the psalms. However, we all know the moral law written on our hearts and should need little prompting to turn from evil. This psalm is a brief prayer that we could all say daily begging God for help in obedience.

**Second Reading: Corinthians 7:29-31.** In this letter, Paul is being somewhat extreme in telling us to renounce the ways of the world, but in his day the only way to emphasize a point was to repeat or exaggerate. So, ladies, do not be offended by St. Paul's statement. He really is addressing everyone to go to whatever extreme it takes to turn from evil because we never know when we will run out of the opportunity to do so.





### Guest Speaker: Rev. Dr. Karen Petersen Finch

The Rev. Dr. Karen Petersen Finch is an ecumenical theologian in the Reformed tradition who specializes in dialogue with Roman Catholic theology at the local, national, and international levels. Karen is Professor of Pastoral Leadership at The Presbyterian College in Montréal, QC, Canada and represents the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) in the Reformed-Catholic Dialogue in the United States. Karen earned her doctoral degree from Gonzaga University with a dissertation recommending the theological method of Bernard Lonergan, S.J. for ecumenical dialogue. She later studied Lonergan as a Fellow of the Lonergan Institute at Boston College in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts. Her book, Grassroots Ecumenism: The Way of Local Christian Reunion, is currently inspiring multilateral dialogue among lay people in the West Island of Montreal.





## Have you ever wondered what to do with that old pair of prescription eyeglasses? Here's the perfect solution!

## **Bring eyeglass donations to Holy Family Parish** and place them in the clear box in the hall entrance.

Your donations will be sent to the Canadian Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centre (CLERC) in Calgary, Alberta where Lions volunteer their time and services to prepare eyeglasses for distribution, cleaning and classifying each pair by prescription.

Once the CLERC has prepared the glasses they are given to qualified missions delivering glasses to the needy around the world.

According to The World Health Organization, 153 million people have uncorrected refractive errors (near-sightedness, far-sightedness or astigmatism). Most of these vision impairments are quickly diagnosed and easy to treat with corrective lenses.

Still, millions of people in developing nations are pushed deeper into poverty simply because they don't have corrective eyeglasses. They can't learn, because reading is difficult. They can't work to the best of their ability, because they can't see clearly.

For children, clear vision means a better education, healthier development and a better quality of life. For adults, it means greater employment opportunity and economic strength. For seniors it means less dependence on others.



## What types of eyeglasses are collected?

New and used reading, single vision, bifocal, children, safety, swim goggles with prescription lenses and both prescription and non-prescription sunglasses (clip-ons and glasses). Glasses may consist of glasses in frames, frames only, or uncut lenses.

### Cases are NOT needed.

Broken glasses and loose lenses are also accepted. Lions have partners who will recover metals and other components from broken glasses.
