
The gospel reading of last Sunday showed us Mark's skill as a narrator – capturing so much with a few words. He shows this same skill in today's continuation of his gospel's introductory passage. As Jesus spends the Sabbath with the disciples he has invited to join him, the events of the day point to significant characteristics of the ministry Jesus is to undertake.

Capernaum, the hometown of Simon Peter, was to

become the headquarters of this Galilean ministry. That Jesus regularly took part in the worship of the synagogue had great significance. He had no intention of setting aside the authentic traditions of old Israel; he came to renew them and bring the realisation of all that they foreshadowed. In doing this he identified with the role of Israel's prophets, as expressed in the first reading from Deuteronomy - a text looked upon as messianic in the time of

Jesus. The people recognised that the teaching of the scribes - with their repetitious appeal to the authority of other interpreters of the Law - contrasted with the teaching of Jesus. In the tradition of the prophets, his teaching had a ring of authority, as it gave expression to Jesus' own convictions. Already there is intimated a contrast and conflict that is to shape the career of the Saviour.

The authority that so impresses the people is expressed, not only in word, but also in action. For the conflict that is to shape the life of Jesus is far more than a squabble about the interpretation of the Law. Sent by the Father as the world's Saviour, he must do battle with the forces of



remarkable display of prophetic authority: 'Here is a teaching that is new, and with authority behind it'. Thus, in describing this eventful Sabbath, Mark alerts us to a subtext that will be present in his telling of the story of Jesus' ministry: Who is this man? Mark's gospel will seek to lead the reader beyond inadequate and superficial views of the Saviour, reflecting the challenge Jesus faced as he presented himself to his audiences.

From Today's Reading

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20 [71b]. Here Moses, the most influential person of the Old Testament, is teaching his followers and the Jewish people about the future, and how they should conduct themselves in matters of faith and morals when they finally enter the Promised Land. He promises that God will send a great person, "... a prophet like himself" who will lead God's people. Although this is referring to the prophets that God will send later, it cannot be overlooked that Jesus is the *ultimate* Prophet. Thus, Moses was referring to Jesus and instructing his people to pay attention and take what He says to heart. Moses spoke to his people for God whereas Jesus speaks to His people because He is God.

Responsorial Psalm 95:1-9, is a meditation on the events of the Israelites' wandering in the desert. They grumbled and griped about Moses' leadership and their own situation of having no water or fresh food, which was indicative of their lack of faith in God and in Moses. The whole psalm is an exhortation to "hang in there," and to listen and obey the voice of God.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35. This is a continuation of Paul's letter read this week, in which he talks about getting distracted by things of "this world." He is not making a case for the single life over the married life. Rather, he is pointing out that



Our journey from humble beginnings celebrating Mass at St. Bernadette and St. Jerome schools to our current location near Riffel High School is a testament to the vision and hard work of our parishioners.




Over the years, the dedication of the Catholic Women's League, the Knights of Columbus, parish youth, and families has transformed Holy Family Parish into a vibrant and blessed place of worship.



However, as we reflect on the rich history of our parish, it is evident that our beloved building, which has served us faithfully, is showing signs of **wear and tear.**

Our carpets, once vibrant, have wrinkled and faded in high-traffic areas. The paint in our building, a canvas of our shared journey, is worn, chipped, and stained. Outside, crumbling pavers, stairs, and failing planters reflect the toll of time.





On February 26, 2023, a portion of our ceiling collapsed—a stark reminder that our aging building needs our help. We are called to action, as stewards of this sacred space, to ensure it continues to serve in the future.

Our Vision:

We embark on the Holy Family Parish Building Renewal Project with the aim of **re-invigorating** our worship space and ensuring the longevity of our cherished building. This project encompasses various critical improvements to address the wear and tear accumulated over the years.

This includes:

Ceiling Renovation:

Our first priority is the repair of our ceiling to current code, ensuring the safety and sanctity of our worship space.

Carpet Replacement:

Replacing worn carpets in the nave and foyer is essential to creating a welcoming and comfortable environment for all who enter.

Interior Refresh:

Revitalizing the church proper with fresh paint and sound paneling, enhancing the aesthetics and acoustics, creating an atmosphere conducive to prayer and reflection.

Altar Area Improvements:

Enhancing the altar area will accommodate larger gatherings and special celebrations. This includes improving safety and accessibility, relocating the Tabernacle to the foot of the crucifix, and removing the non-functional baptismal font.

Front Entrance Exterior Renewal:

Revitalizing the front entrance exterior involves removing failing pavers and planters, landscaping, regrading, and replacing failing steps to meet current safety codes.




