# Fourth S

There is often a time in a long journey when we find the going hard. The enthusiasm with which we set out has faded, and there is still a long way to go. At this stage in our Lenten journey we may be inclined to identify with Nicodemus of today's gospel - not daring, as a well

known Pharisee, to consult Jesus openly, he came 'by night', weighed down in his heart, no doubt, by an interior darkness of confusion and embarrassment.

In our disappointment with our lives, the darkness seems SO real and overwhelming. The first reading, telling the story of old Israel – a story of unfaithfulness. stubborn selfishness. destruction and exile - reminds us how often human history has been filled with darkness, right down to our own day. In the second reading from the letter to the Ephesians, Paul confidently confronts this darkness: for him reliance upon false and selfish securities is to embrace 'death'.

If we are inclined to feel demoralised at this point in our Lenten journey, we are invited by today's readings to find again the source of new energy and encouragement. In the midst of the deepest darkness the true Light shines! Old Israel finds that God's designs will not be frustrated by their foolishness and selfishness - the conqueror of the Babylonians sends them back to rebuild the temple. Paul announces to those who are in danger of losing their way the astounding truth at the centre of our faith - God's free gift to a lost world of new life in Christ: our redeemed

humanity is God's 'work of art', we each have our part to play in the realisation of God's great designs.


But it is especially in climax of today's readings, the words spoken to Nichodemus, by Jesus - the Light of the World - that all our darkness is dispelled! These words

> are perhaps the most quoted of the Gospels. Let us not take them for granted, but take them to heart and rejoice in the new life they bring: 'God loved the world so much that he gave his own Son, so that everyone who believes in him ... may have eternal life'. A world weighed down by the darkness of failure and selfishness must know, Jesus says, that he came from the Father, not 'to condemn' but to bring reconciliation and life.

As we take our bearings in the middle of a long journey, we often find new purpose and energy. Reflecting at this point in our journey of Lent, on the burdens we carry, can bring us to find again, in a more

personal way, the essential truth of our Christian faith, the great truth we are celebrate at the end of our journey.

# From Today's Reading

**First Reading: 2 Chronicles 36:14-23.** 1st and 2nd Chronicles (from the Old Testament) give us a brief overview of the evils of the Jewish monarchy (11th Century to 6th Century BC) that lead up to the Babylonian Exile in the early part of the 6th Century, BC. Indeed, all of the Old Testament is filled with stories of how evil reigned unchecked. The Jewish people had only the Mosaic Law to govern them, and this was mostly ignored during the monarchy. Nevertheless, after a long period of exile (approximately 50 years), God sent an inspired servant to release the Jewish exiles and return them to Jerusalem.

**Responsorial Psalm 137:1-6**, is a song that the exiles sang in Babylon during their time of captivity. When they finally realized why they were there, they repented and vowed to live according to the teachings of God and Moses. Unfortunately, their change of heart didn't last long.

**Second Reading: Ephesians (2:4-10).** Here Paul is teaching the Ephesians, and us, that despite our transgressions, God still loves mankind and wants to help us overcome our sinful ways through the gift of grace. Grace is one of the many benefits flowing from the death and resurrection of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, something that the people of the Jewish monarchy did not have. 





Dear Friends,

It is with heartfelt prayer and a renewed spirit of compassion that we enter this Lenten season. This year, as in other years, we are surrounded by the suffering and needs of others, which can overwhelm and overcome us. We hear the cries of our time in the prophet Jeremiah, who laments,

"My anguish, my anguish! I writhe in pain! Oh, the walls of my heart! My heart is beating wildly; I cannot keep silent; for I hear the sound of the trumpet, the alarm of war."<sup>i</sup>

This prayer for deliverance comes from the depths of the prophet's soul. These words echo Christ's words on the Cross, which we will hear during Holy Week, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"<sup>ii</sup> As we look around, war and violence seem to arise in every corner of the earth. Disasters, both natural and human-caused, affect everyone in some way, but particularly affect those who are marginalized, lacking permanent shelter, and without adequate resources. Most especially, our hearts go out to those who lack even food during these times of upheaval. With great distress, we learn that even in an age of apparent wealth and opulence, there are over 828 million people, created in the image and likeness of God, who go to bed hungry each night.<sup>iii</sup>

God invites us to seek ways to join in the healing of the wounds of our sisters and brothers. Development and Peace – Caritas Canada provides a way for us to reach out to people we will likely never meet, but who are our sisters and brothers in the Lord., Through its projects, Development and Peace seeks to provide an active and life-changing solidarity with those in need, and who in many ways are being forgotten.

Development and Peace stands with small-scale food producers, such as farmers, fisherfolk, and pastoralists, who form the social fiber of countless communities and feed most of the world's population while still experiencing a large degree of poverty themselves.<sup>iv</sup> Through its partners, Development and Peace accompanies those who work every day to feed their families and communities by the generous bounty of God's creation. In Nigeria, the Health of Mother Earth Foundation (HOMEF) helps farmers stand up for their rights and recover community land from rampant oil pollution. In Indonesia, PAYOPAYO (which means "Scarecrow" in the local Mandar language, a symbol of friendship and mutual support among the rural folk) supports community-wide youth engagement in sustainable agriculture. Finally, in Bolivia, Fundacion Nuna Bolivia helps families improve their farming techniques to produce a variety of foods, ensuring ecological and economic sustainability for their community. Development and Peace reminds us that it is with and through these partner organizations, made up of extraordinary people, that we can effect tremendous change in our global community.<sup>v</sup>

I urge you to support Development and Peace – Caritas Canada in their campaign for 2024, **Create Hope: Reaping our Rights**, by giving generously to Share Lent collections at your parish (or through the means listed below). I invite you to be inspired by the ingenuity of the grassroots organizations that partner with Development and Peace by hearing their stories and sharing them with your friends, families, and parish communities. Above all, I encourage you pray for all those who work for justice in our country and in every corner of our world. God is at work in our world, and invites us to join in this holy and arduous work of restoring peace and justice to our wounded world.




